**The Graduate Record Examination (GRE)** is a multiple-choice admissions test intended for applicants to graduate schools. **A New GRE Revised GENERAL TEST** is available.

Registration for the new GRE revised General Test, which will be given starting August 1, 2011 is now open and can be completed at [www.ets.org/gre/revised\\_general/register](http://www.ets.org/gre/revised_general/register). Students registering to take the new revised version between August 1 and September 30 can save 50% on the cost of the test. However, if you need your GRE scores to be reported before November, you need to register to take the old version of the test, which you can do at: [www.ets.org/gre/general/register](http://www.ets.org/gre/general/register). Changes to the GRE and the new scoring formula can be found at: [http://www.ets.org/gre/revised\\_general/know](http://www.ets.org/gre/revised_general/know). Scores from either version of the GRE will still be usable for 5 years.

**The Law School Admission Council (LSAC)** is a nonprofit corporation that provides unique, state-of-the-art products and services to ease the admission process for law schools and their applicants worldwide. More than 200 law schools in the US, Canada, and Australia are members of the Council and benefit from LSAC's services. Founded in 1947, the Council is best known for administering the Law School Admission Test (LSAT). The LSAT is an important standard that aids law schools in their evaluation of applicants. Administered four times each year in testing centers throughout the world, the LSAT is the first step in the law school admission process. All American Bar Association (ABA) approved law schools and many other law schools require applicants to take the LSAT. Some schools place greater weight than others on the LSAT; most law schools do evaluate your full range of credentials.

The test consists of five 35-minute sections of multiple-choice questions. Four of the five sections contribute to the test taker's score. The LSAT is designed to measure skills that are considered essential for success in law school: the reading and comprehension of complex texts with accuracy and insight; the organization and

management of information and the ability to draw reasonable inferences from it; the ability to think critically; and the analysis and evaluation of the reasoning and arguments of others.

Test takers frequently wonder whether they can improve their LSAT score by taking a second time. Normally you may not take the LSAT more than three times in any two-year period.

The next LSAT dates are: June 6, 2011, October 11, 2011, December 3, 2011 and February 11, 2012

LSAC provides additional services and programs including: **Credential Assembly Service (CAS)**, which streamlines law school admission by allowing applicants to have all transcripts, recommendations, and evaluations sent only once to LSAC; the **Candidate Referral Service** which makes it possible for law school candidates to provide information about themselves that will make it easy for law schools to recruit them; **Law School Forums**; **Diversity Initiatives**; and **Test Preparation Publications and Law School Guides**.

**Law School and New LSAT ID Requirements**  
Starting with the June 2011 test, LSAC will no longer thumbprint candidates for the Law School Admissions Test (LSAT). All registrants will be required to affix a recent photograph to their LSAT admission ticket. The photograph must have been taken within the last six months and show only the candidate's face and shoulders. It must be clear enough so there is no question about identity, and it must be no larger than 2x2 inches or 5x5 cm and no smaller than 1x1 inch or 3x3 cm.
