The Institute of International Education (IIE) is pleased to announce that it will re-launch the Freeman-ASIA Program with a generous grant from the Freeman Foundation. Applications can be submitted online starting in January 2011 for study abroad beginning in Summer 2011. Freeman-ASIA scholarships will be available for study abroad anytime through the 2012-13 academic year, with application deadlines listed on the program website.

Freeman-ASIA provides financial support to American undergraduates with demonstrated financial need to study abroad for academic credit during the summer, semester or academic year in one of 15 countries/regions in East and Southeast Asia. Award amounts vary from \$3,000 - \$7,000 depending on the length of study.

The program's goal is to increase the number of Americans with first-hand exposure to and understanding of Asia and its peoples and cultures. Upon their return to the U.S., students are required to promote study in Asia by sharing their experiences with peers on their home campuses and in their communities.

SCHOLARSHIPS, GRANTS, & FELLOWSHIPS FOR GRADUATE STUDY

The **James Madison Foundation Fellowships** were created to honor Madison's legacy and principles by providing support for graduate study that focuses on the Constitution—its history and contemporary relevance to the practices and policies of democratic government.

- Teachers, college seniors, and college graduates who intend to become teachers of American history, American government, or social studies at the secondary school level (grades 7-12) are eligible to apply.
- The fellowships are intended exclusively for graduate study leading to a master's degree.
- Fellows may attend any accredited institution of higher education in the US for either a Master of Arts in American history or in political science; or an MA in Teaching concentrating on American Constitutional history, government, political institutions, or political theory; or a Master of Education with a concentration in American history, government, political institutions, or political theory.
- Each James Madison Fellow must commit to teach American history or social studies in grades 7-12 for no less than one year for each year of study under the fellowship.
- Fellowships carry a maximum stipend of \$24,000 for up to two years of full-time study.

The Fellow's proposed plan of graduate study should contain substantial constitutional coursework. Fellows are encouraged to choose institutions that offer courses that closely examine the origins and development of the US Constitution, the evolution of political theory and constitutional law, the effects of the Constitution on society and culture in the US, or other such topics directly related the Constitution. Nomination by the SJC Fellowship Committee is not required but you may want to have your application reviewed before your submit it. The **Wellstone Fellowship** is designed to increase the number of low-income, American Indian and Alaska native, Asian American, Black/African American, Latino, and Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander social justice leaders. Candidates must demonstrate an interest in health care policy as a tool for reducing racial and ethnic health disparities and in using organizing and advocacy skills to achieve social changes. The Wellstone Fellow plays an integral role in the work of Families USA's Minority Health Initiatives Department. The Fellow's primary responsibilities include assisting in the organization of conferences and trainings for advocate community leaders, and journalists; drafting talking points, blogs, policy briefs, fact sheets, and other publications; and developing content for Families USA's website and email lists. One candidate will be selected and will receive an annual stipend of approximately \$38,000 and excellent health care benefits.
