## Seniors – Don't Forget the GRE

The GRE is a standardized test required for admission to most graduate programs. It is designed to examine the kind of thinking students will need to be capable of in grad school, such as verbal reasoning, quantitative reasoning, and analytical writing. In August 2011, the GRE test was revised and refined to be more informative for graduate admissions committees.
